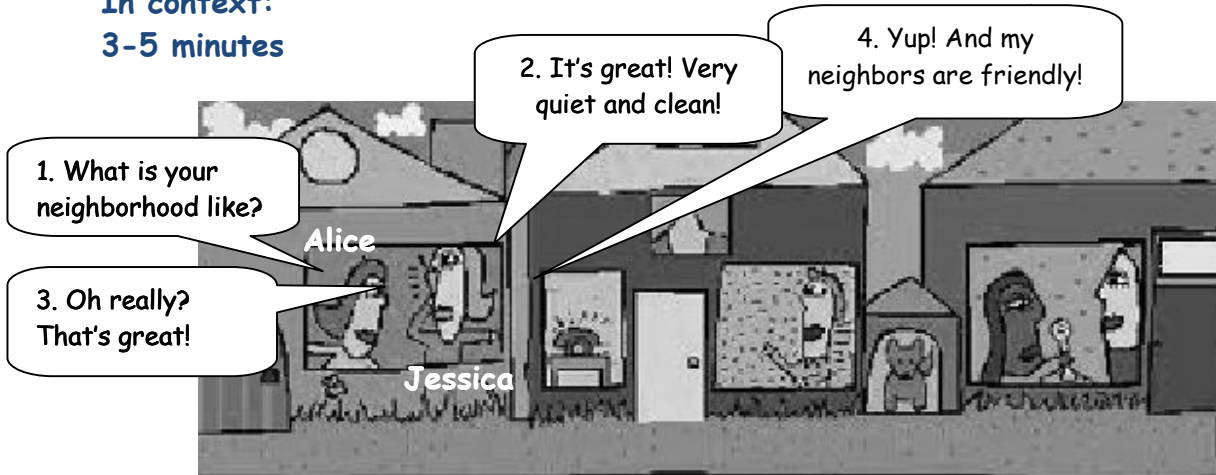


Where do you live? Your Neighborhood

9. Clean - without dirt (opposite of dirty)  (clean)
10. Dirty - a lot of dirt or trash (opposite of clean)  (dirty)
11. Friendly - another way to say "nice" or "welcoming"
